

ACWAY Report for UN World Interfaith Harmony Week 2017

"DIVERSITY"

Background

A Common Word Among the Youth (ACWAY) is a movement of young peace ambassadors from around the world who believe that dialogue and interfaith and intercultural activities have the capacity to build strong, resilient and peaceful communities. Established in 2015, ACWAY is an extension of the 2007 'A Common Word between Us and You' initiative which received global acceptance translated through 138 high-profile signatories, dozens of publications, over 900 press coverage, 6 adopted university programs, 4 prestigious awards and the UN resolution of World Interfaith Harmony Week.

Following the 1st ACWAY Training and International Forum in Rabat Morocco in December 2015, 100 ACWAY fellows from over 74 countries pledged to deliver interfaith or/and intercultural activities in their respective society based on the context-specific issue in that region. Up to February 2017 ACWAY has delivered over 70 activities in various ranges of spectrums from dialogues, discussion, seminar, workshop, exhibition, cultural performance, online campaigns, photo contest and many more. The topics that are being brought up by ACWAY fellows vary such as interreligious gap, women empowerment, education for youth, sports, refugee crisis, media, etc.

ACWAY participated last year in the UN World Interfaith Harmony Week, and this year ACWAY fellows joined the celebration with global activities under the theme of DIVERSITY. Activities centered around this theme were conducted in many countries.

Added Value of ACWAY approach:

- 1) ACWAY is volunteer run all activities are self-funded by the Fellows and the partners they bring on board
- 2) ACWAY is a youth led and driven movement of dedicated young people aged 18-40
- 3) ACWAY fellows are a mix of many faiths/religions/cultures (and none) from over 74 countries
- 4) ACWAY is about ACTION and the fellows do exactly that deliver local, national and international activities to promote peace and understanding



This year the ACWAY fellows, during our 2nd International Forum in Brisbane, decided to deliver a series of activities under the common theme of DIVERSITY during the UN World Interfaith Harmony Week. **This demonstrated harmony in both collaboration and delivery, united under one common campaign.**

List of ACWAY activities for UN World Interfaith Harmony Week 2017

1) Interfaith Harmony in Kolkata (Kolkata, INDIA)

Euphrates Kolkata, CYPAN, Pace48 and ACWAY came together to document a case study. How *Durga Puja* (the biggest Hindu festival) was celebrated in Md Ali Park, in a Muslim locality and with the support of people who mostly belong to faiths other than Hinduism. It was done during the IHW 1-7th February with a team of 8 young people. We had several meetings on planning and arranging for the resources. The visit to Puja has been dedicated to build a communication, which resulted in great support from the Hindu community to contribute in making this historical event each year a grand success. The documentary was shot in their office over a period of two days and was then edited. The transcript was prepared and was approved by the participants we interviewed.

2) Diversity Talk (Dushanbe, TAJIKISTAN)

With main purpose to bring together young people from different backgrounds and involve them in discussions and inspire them for local action to make good things in diverse ways, a diversity talk was conducted in Dushanbe, Tajikistan. The participants were representatives of local high school and university ages around 16-20 years old to promote recognition of value of cultural variety and to promotion of an active role of youth in construction of intercultural dialogue in local communities through their visions of Diversity and Harmony.

Conducted on January 30th 2017, this activity is cooperation between ACWAY, Cultural Centre Bactria and local high schools and university as a part of campaign for the UN World Interfaith Harmony Week 2017.





3) Diversity in Modern Society / Colors of Diversity (Khudjand, TAJIKISTAN)

ACWAY Ambassador, Firuza Abdulaeva, working together with Tajik College of Culture and local youth are supporting the idea and initiative of students workshop to bring together the young people and involve them into the discussion of diversity with two main topics which were: **Diversity as Key for Understanding**, and **Existence with No Diversity.** The activity was also included:

- Story sharing
- Games, puzzles
- Hot discussions
- Playing situations

- Dialogue between two groups
- Watching short movie clips about Diversity.



This activity had over 40 attendees and participant activity involved in the discussion by leading the two different discussion groups and made motto of the workshop:

World.Peace.Diversity



4) Istanbul Diversity Event (Istanbul, TURKEY)

In cooperation with Center for Cross Cultural Communication, Istanbul, ACWAY Fellow Khadija Dohry organized a diversity event on 12th of Feb that included the following activities as a follow up of World Interfaith Harmony week:

- A brief presentation on ACWAY and its youth involvement by Khadija
- An introductory presentation on the work of Cross Cultural Communication Center in Istanbul
- Table discussions on "Diversity and the role of the youth in promoting harmony" over breakfast
- A Calligraphy workshop
- An outdoor event that included visits to Mosques/Churches/synagogues in ISTANBUL

The objective of the project was to strengthen communication between young Istanbulians from different backgrounds and faiths





5) Promoting ACWAY Message Among African Students in Turkey (Istanbul, TURKEY)

In cooperation with African Student Research Center, Ankara, we held an event on counteracting violent extremism in Africa on 14th Jan 2017 and ACWAY Fellow Khadija Dohry delivered a presentation on the role of ACWAY as a youth movement in promoting peace and understanding as well as facilitated the discussions on the challenges faced in project implementation.







6) ACWAY Interfaith & Diversity Harmony (Tamale, GHANA)

On February 8, 2017; ACWAY Interfaith youth team of volunteers in Ghana had a training session on the implementation of their Interfaith camp; Diversity Harmony project in Kanvilli, a suburb of Tamale. A total of 9 youth volunteers offered to work on this project, the first session of training led by ACWAY fellow Inusah Akansoke Al-Hassan. The training concentrated on Interfaith and Diversity issues within the Kanvilli community. The aim was to raise awareness among residents of Kanvilli, a suburb of Tamale of the need for interreligious and diversity coexistence.







7) ACWAY Interreligious Understanding & Cooperation (Tamale, GHANA)

On February 19, 2017; in celebrating the UN World Interfaith Harmony Week 2017, ACWAY Interfaith youth team of volunteers in Ghana conducted a courtesy visit to the Winners Chapel International Church as part of fostering Interfaith Harmony. ACWAY fellow Inusah Akansoke Al-Hassan led a team of 8 volunteers to meet leaders of the Church to discuss issues on inter-religious cooperation within the Kanvilli community, a suburb of Tamale. The Church pledged its support for ACWAY and its social activities in fostering Interfaith Harmony in the Kanvilli community.







8) Multiculturalism in Our Globalized World (Baku, AZERBAIJAN)

On February 4, 2017, Caspian Business Center, Baku, Azerbaijan, ACWAY fellow Lola Matmusaeva conducted a workshop on multiculturalism involving High School students, University students and young professionals with the help of American Councils that offered their Conference Room and members of Azerbaijani Youth Development Organization who helped in organization of the event, particularly with food and activities.

The purpose of the activity was to help Azerbaijani youth to understand the importance of multiculturalism in all spheres of their lives and know the ways to treat it and approach it in today's globalized world. Also, allow the Azerbaijani young people to be exposed to different perspectives and learn from an expert about dialogue and communication in a multicultural world. This activity was organized to celebrate the UN World Interfaith Harmony Week 2017.



9) Bridging the Divides Photography Exhibition (Dhaka, BANGLADESH)

The theme of the photography contest was based on the many different community, religious and diverse population that live together with different faiths. Through this photography contest and exhibition, we reached the heart of the people with the concept of togetherness among different faiths and diverse background. ACWAY fellow, Anupoma Troyee said that "this photography contest contributes to sharing the true diversity prevailing in our country and make us visualize the importance of harmony, peace and togetherness to make the world a better place".

The weeklong activity took place in Dhaka, from 1st to 7th February of 2017. In this week, participants from varying belief, cultural background, educational backgrounds got the opportunity to showcase the photos that focused on our diversity and togetherness. The photos collected through the online submission was sorted and judged by the renowned photographers of the country. The best three photos got awarded with crest and a certificate in the closing ceremony. The best twenty photos were printed and showcased in EMK Center for two weeks. The photography exhibition had a grand opening in presence of US Ambassador to Bangladesh, Mercia Bernicat and Dr. Kazi Nurul Islam, Founder Chairperson, Department of World Religion & Culture, Dhaka University.

Bridging the Divides

Observing World Interfaith Peace and Harmony Week

Since October 2010, the
United Nations has adopted
the first week of February as
World Interfaith Peace and
Harmony Week. Bangladesh's
long fostered culture of
religious harmony is under a
threat now more than ever.
Gen Lab, a youth
organisation aims to create a
platform for youth to engage
in social development
process of the country by
acting together to bring about
positive change. "Bridging



the Divides - Bangladesh Peace & Harmony Week" has been Gen Lab's success story. With a view to attaining intercultural tolerance among young people coming from diverse religious and cultural backgrounds, it is a platform to speak for peace, and tolerance, at a time when their peers are being poisoned by hate speech and seduced by divisive discourse. Bridging the Divides is an award-winning project of KAICIID, Morocco grant by Anupoma Niloya Troyee who is the Bangladeshi peace ambassador of A Common Word Among the Youth.

On February 2, a cultural programme called Soul Search set the tone for the week. Bangladeshis have, since time immemorial, united to the rhythm of Sufi, Kafi, Kirtan, folk, Lalon, Marfati which convey the message of humanity and peace. Young performers from NSU and BRACU and musician Joy Shahriar offered some Sufi, Baul & Marfoti, folk, classical songs while giving insights behind their lyrics, beauty of religious diversity and synchronicity of different cultures.

Following this event, an art competition among school kids on the theme of interfaith harmony was conducted the next day in We Foundation School. The aim was to sow the seeds of intercultural diversity in the young minds of children from grade 1 to 3. On February 6, US Ambassador Marcia Bernicat inaugurated the photo exhibition. The exhibition introduced 20 best photographs focusing religious coexistence and rich cultural ethnicity of Bangladesh. During the award giving ceremony, awards were handed over to the winners of essay competition as well – school-goers who demonstrated unprecedented consideration of the theme. Ratul Dev, founder of Gen Lab, said, "In surge of extreme religious violence, it is now clear that today's youth will decide the future of our country whether we brand ourselves as a secular Bangladesh believing in coexistence and harmony or a nation blind with primitive notions leading violence and terrorism."



10) Art Competition Among School Kids (Dhaka, BANGLADESH)

Besides the Photo Contest, ACWAY fellow, Anupoma Troyee in partnership with 'Gen Lab' conducted an art competition among the school kids on 3rd of February within the theme related to interfaith harmony and peace. The participating kids were from the age of 5-12. Through this art competition we tried to promote the concept of harmony & peace among diverse group of people. We gave prizes to the best three artistic drawings among the participants. We also shared these paintings among partners and supporters and youth organizations to promote the concept of peace among different faiths and cultures. Partnership was established among different art schools of Dhaka and participants got praised even though all are not winners. We believe that kids are the future backbone hence their encouragement in such social cause is important.



11) "I BELIEVE IN" Instagram Campaign (Kazan, RUSSIA)

Instagram campaign is for young people to share their beliefs and to show the world that youth around the world despite being extremely diverse, have "common words". These are peace, love, friendship and family among others. This activity also meant to show the world that religious prejudices are fiction and no hatred is welcomed by 2017 youth. The campaign is led by ACWAY fellow, Liliya Khasanova from Russia, while participants are young people from all over the world, who are willing to share their ideas and promote interfaith harmony. The project started during interfaith harmony week (1-7 February). Young people share their portrait picture and statements about what they believe in and what keeps them inspired. 12) ACWAY Medical Camp 2017 (Islamabad, PAKISTAN)

Coming from the situation in Sidhupura, Faisalabad where the people are lack of outdoor and indoor medical treatment because of the insufficient number of doctors, nurses, and paramedic staff, ACWAY fellow, Hassan Saeed, worked together with YES Alumni Pakistan, Society of International Education, and iEARN Pakistan to ACWAY organized a day long Medical Awareness Camp on February 25th which served approximately 400 patients from Christian Colony in Sidhupura, Faisalabad. In Pakistan, there is dire need of quality public health awareness as the mothers are not aware of prevention for small diseases that result in severe issue for families, which are not well-off and cannot afford medical tests and medicines. In order to address the issue, team geared up to organize the camp that not only provided medical tests but also the medicines to the targeted beneficiaries. A team of doctors and expert along with a team of volunteers facilitated the patients with free medical check-ups and medicines. The project nourished the ties between Muslim and Christian community and cleared misconceptions.





13) Promoting Interfaith Harmony thought Cleanliness Drive (Faisalabad, PAKISTAN)

Continuing the Medical Campaign the day before, ACWAY fellow, Hassan Saeed carried out a cleanliness drive to promote interfaith harmony at F-6 Christian Colony on February 26th and educated regarding ways in which diseases can be avoided during winters. The reason why this activity was focused on Christian community was Christian communities are marginalized and not given any importance in mainstream education and extracurricular activities which leads to a sense of exclusion. The activities included collecting trash, disposing them, installing trash cans and educating the participants regarding keeping their surroundings clean. The team also explained the importance of cleanliness to avoid elements of diseases at school and home. They also learned about ways in which hand-washing is done successfully. Overall, the day focused on highlighting healthy patterns for the better. A total of 60 residents and 10 volunteers participated in the project.











14) Faith in Tune: Tu' Bishvat Interculturelle Feier (Berlin, GERMANY)

Project "An Interfaith Celebration of Tu' Bishvat" (Jewish Holiday for Trees and Nature) is a multicultural project that was being conducted in Berlin, Germany with Minor Refugees and Youth from the Jewish High School, accompanied by a Rabbi and an Imam in Berlin, Germany by ACWAY Fellow Anja Fahlenkamp.





15) Embracing Intercultural Diversity for Peaceful Election in Kenya

Heading to election in Kenya by August 2017, the media has been covered by hate speech, tribal grouping and less encouraging spirit to bring together everyone, rather to divide them. Our ACWAY fellow, Zachariah Munayi and his volunteer groups conducted activity called Diversity in Action by interviewing people from different tribe in Kenya to talk about each other's existence and to send the message of peace to everyone.
