DAY 2: YOUTH FOR CHANGE

Activity: Conducted 5 DIFFERENT campaigns in 5 different places of Kollam district, Kerala, India.

Target group: Students from 10th STD to 12th STD

Timing: 10 am to 4 pm

Outcome: The students showed the way to be the change. Students actively participated in the campaigns and the got appreciations from the crowd and the crowd also participated in the campaign as per the instructions of the students.

<u>Campaign 1</u> Awareness on Traffic Rules

The students painted zebra lines in the road as a part of the safe traffic campaign. Whatever may be the religion; all people need zebra lines to cross the road safely. This was the proclamation by the students. There assembled the students from 4 religions. Even If there is separate caste or religion, the safety measure is always





common in everywhere. The public admired the students. Here they showed our theme YOUTH FOR CHANGE.

Campaign: 2 Protection of wet lands and natural Resources

The pond, which is cleaned and protected by the students, was once the only source of water for the drinking purpose in the Poovachal village of Trivandrum district. Now days the pond was totally polluted and filled with plastic and food wastes. Our committed students cleaned and picked up all plastic wastes from the pond and put some guppy fishes in it to reduce the mosquito reproduction. Students those who participated in the activity realized the importance of protecting natural resources especially water, above all religions or faiths all are using water when they feel thirsty.

The reach of this program was entire village.







Campaign 3: Go Green

The campaign is meant for spreading the message that **Save trees**, **Save nature**. **Go back to Green**.

The students planted the saplings of many trees in public places and donated saplings to the public with a small thought that, whatever may be your religion you need air to inhale. There is no preference of air as per your religion. The students' performance and sincerity were exemplary.

The reach of the program was more than 5000 people.







Campaign 4 : Anti-Drug Campaign

The students conducted an open canvas campaign. It was a canvas with 4 meter length and the students expressed their views on the dangerous aftermath of drug addiction. Then there was an exhibition on drug addiction .Students presented it very well and the public became the part of those campaigns. The message was drug addiction is beyond the concept of religion

DAY 5

Students from both nations shared their experiences from their countries. During this time one girl from an indigenous community wept and make others eyes wet by saying an excited statement. "Thank You dear Japan friends…for touching me, hugging me and kissing me…Yet I didn't have the dare to touch the white skinned people like you. All people are saying, we are the people with fowl smell and god created us without beauty. Even though, you give me a space in your mind. Thanks forever". Finally Indian students performed the dance forms of India as an art feast to their guest.

There was a culture exchange program conducted in three places in association with United Religions Initiative South Africa. The South African Youth Cordinator Ms.Sarah Oliver and Dr. Farah visited these three places and gave an introduction of Uri and World Interfaith Harmony week.
