Article 1 - Organizers

Article 2 – Conditions for Participation & Eligibility

Participation to the photo competition is free and open to any person who is 18 years old or above.

Theme

This photo competition will focus on *impressions of moments of prayer*, in all religions and beliefs, both in community and individually.

Each participant shall submit an entry following this guideline:

Share with us what praying means to you.

Each participant can only submit **one entry** during the period of the competition (December 1st 2017 – January 15th 2018).

Entries will only be accepted by filling the form.

**The participation to the competition implies the acceptance, without reserve, of the integrality of these Terms and Conditions. The non-respect of these rules will result in the disqualification of the participant.

Starting date: The competition will open at 10:00am (GMT +1) on December 1, 2017.

Closing date: The competition will close at 5:00 pm (GMT +1) on January 15, 2018.

Article 3 - Instructions & Rules

1.) Take a photograph that can *illustrate different ways of praying, and comment on your approach.*If you take a picture with a camera, make sure that the photograph is High Resolution [1600 x 1200 pixels minimum]

If you take a photo with a smartphone, make sure that the photo is Full Size [4MP minimum].

- 2.) Fill in the online submission form with your name, last name, age, email, address, country. Link to form: https://goo.gl/forms/MIW9G4IDM8m7FEUa2
- 3.) Write a description/caption on the submission form of **no more than 100 words** (800 characters including spaces) describing what the image is, where it was taken, and how it illustrates an inspiring moment of prayer for you.
- **4.)** Submit the image in .jpeg/jpg format, indicating the name of the photographer on the picture's metadata. Example: surname_name.jpeg

Name of photographer, agency or publication must not be visible on the picture itself.

5.) Read the terms and conditions and check the box on the online submission form to agree before uploading your photo. Once done, upload your image in .jpeg/.jpg format via the form.

A notification will be sent once the entry is registered.

Article 4 – Selection Process

The Photo Competition will end on January 15 2018 at 5:00 pm (GMT +1).

A pre-selection of the 20 best photographs will be carried out by the Photo Competition organizers.

The selection will then be submitted to a panel of **7 judges**, who will select the final winners and runners-up. The judges are:

- Mrs Marie-Hélène Rabier, sociologist and journalist
- Mrs Patty Roig, USA/Cuban painter

The decision of the judges is final and will be based on their assessment of the criteria below:

- The image illustrates an inspiring moment of prayer.
- · The image is artistically appealing.
- The image is accompanied by a description/caption of no more than 100 words explaining why this image is representative of what praying means to you.

Once the selection of the winners and runners up is completed, each will receive a notification email. **Note:** If no response is given acknowledging the acceptance of the prize in a space of 2 days the following person on the list will be informed and awarded.

The winners and runners-up will be communicated on the Facebook and web pages of I.T.OUCH' and Chapel for Europe AISBL and on the Facebook page of *Plateforme Interconvictionnelle Bruxelles*, as well as via social media channels on Facebook and Twitter by the end of January 2018.

Article 5 - Prizes

- 1st prize

The first winner will receive a FNAC voucher worth 100€.

- 2nd prize

The second winner will receive a **voucher** for the photography shop **A. CAMPION sprl in Brussels** (https://www.appareilsphotoscampionbruxelles.be/fr) worth 50€.

- 3rd prize

The third winner will receive the photography book about Brussels "SCULPTURE DE LUMIÈRE/BEELDEND LICHT/LIGHT SCULPTURE" by Patrick Rimoux.

Each of the winners and the 9 runners-up will receive a printed 2018-19 Interfaith Calendar with their selected pictures, once it's published (mid-June) by El Kalima (Centre Chrétien pour les relations avec l'Islam and member of the Plateforme Interconvictionelle Bruxelles).

Article 6 – Intellectual Property Rights

I.T.OUCH' and Chapel for Europe and Plateforme Interconvictionnelle Bruxelles, in the framework of World Interfaith Harmony Week, unlimited non-exclusive use of high-resolution pictures for activities in all media, including social media, online and print, in relation to the competition, the exhibition and all promotional and educational activities for and under the auspices of the World Interfaith Harmony Week without any remuneration being due. It also to be considered that the pictures of the 12 finalists will be used by El Kalima (Centre Chrétien pour les relations avec l'Islam and member of the Plateforme Interconvictionnelle Bruxelles) for an Interfaith Calendar 2018-19.

Credit to the author/photographer will be given wherever and whenever the image is used.
