The University of Lincoln Students' Union Islamic Society Committee hope that you are in the best of health, wealth and faith. Discover Islam Week 2015 has just closed, and the Committee thought you deserved an update of the activities the Society has held - in association with staff, students and external organisations - over the previous weeks.

So What Have We Been Up To?

The aim of the University of Lincoln Students' Union Islamic Society has always been to encourage the University of Lincoln to fulfil the needs of Muslim – or indeed, Non-Muslim – students, by providing them with the benefits and facilities needed to improve themselves academically, spiritually, physically, financially and socially. This year, community cohesion has provided the drive for many of our activities; this has encouraged wider participation, which, we hope, has simultaneously helped dispel many misconceptions about Islam and helped bring people, places and ideas together.

Discover Islam Week 2015

Discover Islam Week is an annual campaign held by the University of Lincoln Students' Union Islamic Society – a voluntarily student-led organisation - to raise awareness about Islam. It holds guest speakers lectures and various activities and fundraising events to provide a foundation for people of many faiths to come together and celebrate their differences. This provides an opportunity for individuals of different faiths to build close relationships and widen their understanding of one another. The campaign also provides an opportunity for the different groups contributing and participating to work towards a collective good, of benefit to the local community. This year collective action focussed upon raising awareness about the charity St. Barnabas Lincolnshire Hospice which included activities to raise funds for the organisation which supports those with terminal illness and their families.



Listening

Preparations for Discover Islam Week began in November 2014. The prior organisation required for the week gave Members of the University of Lincoln Students' Union Islamic Society Committee the opportunity to speak to people of other faiths. Listening to their ideas, their interests and taking on their opinions about what they would like the week to include. It provided a great opportunity to discuss the various possibilities suggested.

Cooperation

Once the events to include were decided, the staff at the University of Lincoln Students' Union were consulted. A big thank you to: Activities Support Worker, Jo Buckler; Activities Co-ordinator, Tracey Revill and Volunteer Co-ordinator Jane Kilby for their efforts in facilitating in the reams of administrative paper work and back-and-forth emails required to organise the week.

Sensitivity

Rizwaan Chothia, A Police Constable from the Lincolnshire Police Force was consulted in regards to the week's events to evaluate their suitability towards both the staff and students at the University of Lincoln and the local community. It gave the Islamic Society an awareness into sensitive issues and how best to implement the message of inter-faith harmony most effectively. A special thanks to Ben Atkinson, a Digital Media Officer at the University of Lincoln, who designed both artworks used to advertise the campaign through posters and leaflets at the University and through the implementation of social media such as Facebook, Twitter and Instagram



Communication

Once the posters were printed. Students helped display them around the University of Lincoln. The distribution email produced by the University of Lincoln Students' Union Islamic Society was sent out; the Committee was surprised by the feedback they received in replies. It seems that many individuals and organisations to which the email was sent forwarded it on to people who may be interested in the week. It really was an illustration of collective effort!



The leaflets were distributed towards worshippers attending the Islamic Association of Lincoln's Friday Afternoon Congregational Prayer in the city. Worshippers were encouraged to attend with neighbours and friends, by Tanvir Ahmed, the Chairman of the Islamic Association of Lincoln, who also donated 150 translations of the Qur'an towards the literature stands we had organised.



Global Week

Wednesday Evening Lecture - Scientific Facts: As Described in the Qu'ran








Stand Together: Campaign Against Gender-Based Violence

On Thursday Members of the University of Lincoln Students' Union Islamic Society agreed to be featured in a campaigned called Stand Together. Stand together is an action research project that is taking place at the University of Lincoln to tackle the issue of gender-based violence. The Islamic Society was invited by Sundari Anitha, a Criminology Lecturer at the University of Lincoln to work in partnership with other third sector organisations and Students' Union Societies and Clubs to roll out a university-wide prevention education programme, one of the first of its kind in the UK.









It was a great opportunity to dispel any deep-rooted misconceptions about Islam or indeed other faiths finding gender-based violence towards women acceptable. It was emphasised that it has always been unacceptable. The campaign also included participation by Hayley Jayne Wilkinson who has recently been elected as President of the University of Lincoln Students' Union for the following Academic year.









Thursday Evening Lecture - Role Models: Women in Leadership

Appropriately, Thursday evening ended with a Guest Speakers Lecture delivered by Zara Huda Faris from the Muslim Debate Initiative. She discussed the subject Role Models: Women in Leadership. The lecture was attended by many female Psychology students and attracted some debate as to how to address issues of inequality which continue to exist between the sexes.





Friday Afternoon Congregational Prayer: Conviction in Belief

On Friday, the Brothers held the Weekly Friday Afternoon Congregational Prayer. The sermon delivered by Shaykh Omar Babar discussed the conviction in belief a person of faith holds. It encouraged students to be confident when discussing faith explaining free discussion often helps people widen their knowledge and bridge the gap faced by isolated communities. It recognised that the open discussion of faith was conducive to flourishing self-expression. It also reminded staff and students to discuss issues of faith with dignity and respect.



Friday Evening Lecture – Legacy: The Life of the Prophet (PBUH)

Friday Evening finished with the final instalment of Discover Islam Week's Guest Speakers Lectures, which was delivered by Shaykh Omar Babar and discussed Legacy: The Life of the Prophet (PBUH). It was a great opportunity to raise several issues in regards to the violent acts caused by the Charlie Hebdo affair. It reminded those who do not follow any particular faith to empathise with people of all faiths who hold their Lord(s) and Prophet(s) in great esteem. It reminded people that discussions and criticism are commensurate with the teaching of all faiths, raising awareness of the responsibility one has carry to ensure the respect of the other.

High Street Collection: St. Barnabas Lincolnshire Hospice

Saturday was spent making full use of the Street Licence granted by the City of Lincoln Licensing Department by holding a High Street Collection on behalf of the St. Barnabas Lincolnshire Hospice. It was a great way to publicly illustrate how members of two or more faiths can work together for a common good. The distributed balloons ensured that children left with smiles and helped raise awareness about the Hospice and the Inter-Faith work which supports it.



The St. Barnabas Cup & Youth Tournament

On Saturday the University of Lincoln Students' Union Islamic Society held the St. Barnabas Cup and Youth Tournament.

It was a great day with many friends and families visiting the University of Lincoln on one of its most memorable Open Days.
