



## MANIFESTO OF SUPPORT FOR THE MARYAM MOVEMENT

We believe that the lack of understanding on interreligious and intercultural diversity and intolerance can often lead to tensions and conflicts between different cultures and faiths. Therefore, we are committed to strengthen intercultural and interfaith dialogues in order to enhance mutual understanding and respect as well as to foster peaceful co-existence and prosperity among diverse cultures and religions in the country;

We believe that Mary has become a relevant and unifying icon to both Christians and Muslims. The Maryam Movement, derived from a convergence of Mary and Maryam, serves as a bridge between Christians and Muslims.
