



HISTORY OF WORLD INTERFAITH HARMONY

In 2007 The Common Word Initiative called for Muslim and Christian leaders to engage in dialogue around two common fundamental religious commandments: 'Love of God and Love of the Neighbor.' On October 20, 2010, the United Nations General Assembly unanimously established the World Interfaith Harmony Week, first proposed by King Abdullah II of Jordan, an international leader for peace. This interfaith resolution widened the original appeal to 'Love of the Good and Love of the Neighbor,' so as to include all people of goodwill, those of other faiths and those with no professed faith.



The week of interfaith harmony seeks to affirm that mutual

understanding and interfaith dialogue constitute important dimensions of a culture of peace. In places where these dialogues occur, people witness greater community cohesion and develop better connections for addressing serious societal issues. Now it provides a platform for all interfaith and goodwill organizations to demonstrate their impact and necessity. The movement is strengthened by building ties among world religions, educating ourselves

about each other, and helping our community appreciate the beauty and diversity of our faith traditions.
