Father Elias welcomed our guest speaker, Jennifer Seelig, the Community Relations Director for new Salt Lake City Mayor Jackie Biskupski. Seelig supported our mission saying, "Seek out other perspectives that you do not hold. Increase your capacity to include others. We need all perspectives," Seelig said.

Seelig talked about her Methodist upbringing and her recent embrace of some Buddhist tenants. "We are complex and holistic beings. We are not easily defined. We must guard against silos, staying within our own world. We do important work to bridge these silos," Seelig said. "This goes beyond tolerance. We are not here to put up with each other, we are here to thrive together," she said. Seelig ended with encouraging words, "You matter very much."

Father Elias invited Josie Stone, Vice-chair of the Interfaith Roundtable to present the Interfaith Roundtable's annual awards. The Community award was awarded to J.B. Singh and the Sikh Community, for his endeavors in having the Sikh Community provide the Langar everyday at the Parliament of the World's Religion held in Salt Lake City in October, unfortunately he was not able to be present. The Individual award was given to Brian Farr for his work in advertising the Roundtable at the Parliament. The "We Can't Do with You" award was presented to Father Elias for being a Father to us all.
