Intercultural Dialogue Institute (IDI) Edmonton and St. Albert United Church celebrated World Interfaith Harmony Week by sharing Noah's Pudding with congregation during the Sunday sermon on February 5th, 2017.

Noah's Pudding (Ashure) is a Turkish dessert that is made of a mixture consisting of grains, fresh and dried fruits and nuts. It is usually served with cinnamon and it has no animal product. It is made all the year and served especially during Muharram, the first month of Islamic calender. Traditionally, Noah's Pudding is made in large quantities and is distributed to friends, relatives, neighbours, regardless of the recipients' religion as an offering of love and peace.

As IDI Edmonton, we continue this custom in Canada by sharing this pudding with everyone.
