Our Aims & Objectives



The World Interfaith Harmony Week seeks to spread the message of harmony and tolerance among the followers of all the world's religions, faiths and beliefs. It seeks to do this by promoting their common basis of "Love of God and Love of the Neighbor, or Love of the Good and Love of the Neighbor." Its message invites everyone, excludes no one, and is purely voluntary.

The objectives behind the World Interfaith Harmony Week, in the words of the author of the United Nations resolution, Prince Ghazi bin Muhammad, are:

To co-ordinate and unite the efforts of all the interfaith groups doing positive work with one focused theme at one specific time annually, thereby increasing their collective momentum and eliminating redundancy.

- To harness and utilize the collective might of the world's second-largest infrastructure (that of places of worship — the largest being that of education) specifically for peace and harmony in the world: inserting, as it were, the right "software" into the world's religious "hardware".
- 2. To permanently and regularly encourage the silent majority of preachers to declare themselves for peace and harmony and provide a ready-made vehicle for them to do so. Moreover, if preachers and teachers commit themselves on the record once a year to peace and harmony, this means that when the next inter-religious crisis or provocation occurs, they cannot then relapse into parochial fear and mistrust, and will be more likely to resist winds of popular demagoguery.

Resolution adopted by the General Assembly

65/5. World Interfaith Harmony Week

The General Assembly,

Recognizing the imperative need for dialogue among different faiths and religions to enhance mutual understanding, harmony and cooperation among people,

Recalling with appreciation various global, regional and subregional initiatives on mutual understanding and interfaith harmony, including the Tripartite Forum on Interfaith Cooperation for Peace, and the initiative "A Common Word",

Recognizing that the moral imperatives of all religions, convictions and beliefs call for peace, tolerance and mutual understanding,

- 1. Reaffirms that mutual understanding and interreligious dialogue constitute important dimensions of a culture of peace;
- 2. Proclaims the first week of February every year the World Interfaith Harmony Week between all religions, faiths and beliefs;
- 3. Encourages all States to support, on a voluntary basis, the spread of the message of interfaith harmony and goodwill in the world's churches, mosques, synagogues, temples and other places of worship during that week, based on love of God and love of one's neighbour or on love of the good and love of one's neighbour, each according to their own religious traditions or convictions;
- 4. Requests the Secretary-General to keep the General Assembly informed of, the implementation of the present resolution.

PROGRAM NOTES

GUEST CONDUCTOR & COMPOSER

Lee R. Kesselman, as a composer, is best known for his operas, choral pieces and solo songs. His works for children have brought him national attention — The Bremen Town Musicians has been performed over 300 times-and commissions to write for school and university choirs, and community, church, and professional ensembles. Mr. Kesselman has been Director of Choral Activities at the College of DuPage in Glen Ellyn, IL since 1981; he is the founder and Music Director of The New Classic Singers and directs The DuPage Chorale and College of DuPage Chamber Singers. He has taught at Doreen Rao's Choral Music Experience Institute since its inception in 1986, served on the faculty of Académie International de Chant Choral in Parthenay, France, and addressed state and divisional conventions of the American Choral Directors Association.

MUSICAL COORDINATOR

Steve Szalaj taught vocal music to children in the public schools for 34 years prior to his "retirement". The founding and current Artistic Director of Voices in Harmony community choir since 1987, he teaches voice and directs choral music at McHenry County College. He has been an active member of the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA) and The Music Educator's National Conference. Mr. Szalaj was the first recipient of the Dr. Marie Ann Vos Music Leadership Award of The McHenry County Music Center for his long commitment to choral music in the community.

The Nasheed Club of the Islamic Foundation School in Villa Park was initiated by Mr. Amro Helmy in 2012. The club is composed of elementary and middle school students. The aim of the Nasheed Club is to provide our students an opportunity to sing and understand musical pieces with Islamic themes in Arabic and English. The Nasheed Club has performed in over ten different interfaith events and other venues. The performances are sung and occasionally accompanied with the oud played by Mr. Helmy.

Amro Helmy is a unique, highly talented Arabic teacher and Oud player who has mastered a large number of styles using different techniques, approaches and textures. His style of playing and compositions has earned Amro considerable international attention. His musical style communicates deeply the emotion to the audience. He began to teach himself how to play Oud at the age 14. He has performed more than fifty concerts around the world and participated in more than ten performances at various interfaith programs in Chicago. During the last five years, Amro's compositional and performance skills witnessed a growth in sophistication resulting in him composing original music for the anti-war video documentary "NO MORE WAR RAFFAT." Beyond his outstanding onstage performances, he is also a teacher of the musical arts in many schools in Chicago. Amro's dedication to his craft and his students ensures that quality music will continue to flourish to future generations.

Campanella Children's Choir was founded in the spring of 2000 and currently acts as the core of Campanella Educational Center. The choir consists of five levels: Beginners, Prelude Choir I & II, Treble Choir and Concert Choir. The first three choral groups are largely made up of Russian-speaking children who primarily perform Russian-language songs. The Concert Choir, on the other hand, consists of children from a variety of cultures and sings a diverse repertoire that focuses on classical music. The Concert Choir consists of 20 students ages 8 through 17.

The ensemble participates in competitions performs in numerous community events throughout the year. In recent years, it performed at Chicago's Adler Planetarium, the Museum of Science and Industry, Northbrook Public Library, Wheeling Park District, and Skokie Public Library. Campanella Concert Choir has been a participant of National Heritage Festival since 2006. Achievements at the festival include highest ranking and Gold Medal in 2012, 2011 and 2010, Gold Medal in 2009 and Outstanding Choral Group award in 2008. In May 2012, 2015, 2017 the group was featured on "Introductions," a program on Chicago area's WFMT Classical music radio station that spotlights promising classical musicians ages 18 and under.

Indian Dance School Director, Gauri Jog is one of the foremost Indian classical dancers and choreographers in America today. She has been practicing Kathak dance since 1975. Her command over rhythm, powerful pirouettes and crisp footwork has made her one of the finest exponents of this dance style. Her acclaimed creations include Shakuntala, Jhansi Ki Rani, Kathak Yatra, East meets West, Fire the Fiery Tale, Kathak Yatra, Ramayana, Kathak Bollywood and Krishna Leela. She brings to life the traditional "art of storytelling" through the technical elements in Kathak. She is very popular especially among younger generation due to her unique approach that combines some Bollywood steps and yoga into the Kathak while taking care not to cross the boundaries of tradition. Her experiments with combining Kathak with Flamenco, Bharatanatyam, Odissi, and Mexican and American Ballet have won many accolades. She has received her training under Guru Madan Pande, Madhurita Sarang and Lalita Hardas. She has attended numerous workshops by eminent Kathak Gurus from India including Pandit Birju Maharaj. Since 1999 Gauri Jog and her group have performed more than 350 dance shows in North America. Over the years she has earned an admirable reputation as a teacher, choreographer and community leader. In 1999, Gauri Jog established the Indian Dance School, a charitable organization to promote physical fitness through dance especially among teens and to learn rich cultural heritage of India. Gauri Jog also imparts Kathak training online and currently has students from 12 countries. The school emphasizes adherence to the classicism of Kathak dance and Hindustani music, ensuring structured training with a strong foundation firmly rooted in tradition. (gaurijog.com)

A Note from the Reverend Dr. Larry Greenfield Executive Director, Parliament of the World's Religions

I remember a time when I didn't think I needed to worry about the future of my children. A time when the future of the earth seemed certain. But I have reached a point in my life where that simply isn't the case anymore, and, looking back, I see that it was never the case; our actions against the Earth and against one another have set us on a bleak path, and it is easy to become discouraged.

This World Harmony Week, I pray that these blessed Sounds of Faith will reach many ears, touch many hearts, and create waves of change that resonate far into the future.






