### **Mission statement:**

### **Concept of the Seminar:**

Since early childhood, I was impressed by Sufi philosophy, poetry and music. The path of devotion, sacrifice and unconditional surrender to Allah, God, Murshid (Guru) fascinated my young mind and spirit.

I also felt that Hindu scriptures were similar in their principles of total surrender (Ananya Sharanagati) and selfless love and devotion (Nishkam Bhakti) Hence, I was inspired to plan this interfaith dialogue with spiritual scholars of Hindu and Islam faiths to enlighten us how the scriptures and teachings of their faiths relate to each other.

This dialogue clearly highlighted that there are more commonalities between all religions and faiths than differences and emphasizing on harmony of religions and unity of existence is the only way to make our world just, sustainable and peaceful for all.

### **Advertisement and Attendance:**

It was attended by 40+ people from various faiths and religions. (see attached pictures) They were from different professions i.e. doctors, pharmacists, attornrys, enginners, accountators and financial planners etc. However, all of them came to promote Interfaith Harmony and Peace.

#### Sajda – A Soulful, Spiritual, and Blisssful Interfaith Presentation Presented By Narendra C. Bhalodkar MD FACC

"Sajda" program will feature some of the finer nuances of Sufi Bollywood and non-Bollywood music. The event highlights the beauty of Indian music and promotes the rich Indian culture/heritage and Harmony.

**Sajda meaning:** The Urdu word Sajda or Sajdah that keeps on appearing in Hindi songs forever is an Arabic word meaning prostration to God in the direction of the Kaaba in Mecca. Sajda is usually done during the daily prayers.

In simpler terms, Sajda is a posture in prayer where one bends one's head in submission to God. Sajda is considered the utmost stage of submission, hence, when someone says s/he performed a Sajda, it means s/he devoted himself / herself completely to someone else.

During our program, we will attempt to use its meaning on a broader sense, i.e. not only



prostration to God but also to the beloved, be it a Guru, Friend, Nature, lover, Spouse etc.

The program will consist of video and audio presentations of Sufi songs. Poems by Amir Khusrow, Rumi, Bulleh Shah, Kabir and others will also be presented. Dr. Bhalodkar will introduce and speak briefly about each of the musical selections. In an attempt to make the program more enjoyable, translations of difficult and somewhat unfamiliar "Urdu" words will be provided.

The program promises to be a soulful one and we hope it will transcend you to a place of Joy, Tranquility and Anand.

### Seminar proceedings:

After welcoming guests, the seminar started with interfaith prayers.

It was followed by a video screening of the Audio/video of the Bhajans, Sufi songs and poetry.

Subsequently, a scholarly discussion by speaker and attendees ensued.

Throughout entire seminar during Power Point Presentation this master slide was projected.



During 2 hours of presentation and interactive discussion we understood deeper and spiritual meaning of "Sajda."

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We explored "Sajda" to use its meaning on a broader sense, i.e. not only prostration to Allah, God but also to the beloved, be it a Guru, Friend, Nature, lover, Spouse etc.

Spiritual poems by Amir Khusrow, Rumi, Bulleh Shah, Kabir, Meera and others were also be presented.
