WIHW Event: Jewish, Christian, and Muslim Personal Stories



Host

Unity is Strength is a fast-growing online forum focused on Israel-Palestine discussion, community-building, and peacebuilding. Its goal is to remain open to the public and to allow airing of diverse, respectful opinions about Israel-Palestine. Ultimately, we explore solutions to Israel-Palestine at any scale, from local to international, that could be based on shared efforts. Unity is Strength has received over one million views in the less than two years of its operation, and has approximately 100 writers and 15 Admins and Moderators. Forum participants may come from all over the world, but are heavily concentrated in Israel, Palestine, and elsewhere in the Middle East and North Africa region. Although Unity is Strength is almost entirely a volunteer effort supported by the community, we are Quora.com's first forum to be awarded small external grants for operating and other expenses. Recently, we were accepted into the United Religions Initiative (URI) as a Cooperation Circle (CC), another first for a Quora forum.

Event

For World Interfaith Harmony Week, we held the event "Jewish, Christian, and Muslim Personal Stories" online, to contribute our part to the larger WIHW efforts of the URI. Our approach was inspired by the culture of Quora.com, where we started. Quora was originally a question-answering website, and its answers are heavily oriented toward personal stories humanizing people across national and cultural barriers. We brought a similar approach to our event, livestreaming and recording a panel of Jewish, Christian, and Muslim active forum participants sharing basic information about their religions and telling personal stories about their experiences as practitioners. All three participants were heavily connected to Israel and Palestine - the Jewish participant came from a family active in Israel issues, and both the Christian and Muslim participants were Palestinian. As a result, the event also promoted a larger message of inter-religious and inter-cultural peacebuilding in Israel-Palestine. Our event was honored with a 2021 World Interfaith Harmony Week Award from the URI.

The event was one of our first video calls and our first explicitly interfaith activity. It also expanded Unity is Strength to two new Internet platforms - <u>Facebook</u> and <u>YouTube</u>. It was live-streamed on our new Facebook group and made available on our new YouTube channel. Before and after the event, the activity was publicized both by our team on our own platforms and by the larger URI to all Cooperation Circles. Across the various Internet platforms, our event was attended or watched by over 150 people.
