## Backgound



EIFDDA- Established 2006 and renewed its license in 2019 as per new Ethiopian Civil Society Proclamation. It is a Consortium of major Faith Based Organization (FBOs) in Ethiopia; with long standing developmental experiences and significant vast presence throughout the country. EIFDDA aimed to engage in the generation of a religion-inspired conception and practice of

development, which can be an alternative to the mainstream materialistic model of development. It envisioned achieving its aim by engaging its members and partners in the complementary and mutually reinforcing learning processes of dialogues and discussions on substantive issues relating to mainstreaming religious values in development. EIFDDA is serving as Interfaith Platforms for partnership and linking, systematic learning, capacity building, advocacy and lobbying, fundraising among others.



EIFDDA is currently implementing the Joint Initiative for Strategic Religious Action (JISRA) with other Faith Based Organizations from diverse Religious denominations including Orthodox, Muslim, Protestant, and Catholic as well as traditional belief groups (Aba Gedas). JISRA works within religious communities to challenge discrimination, extremist tendencies, and hate towards others (intrareligious sphere); facilitate and strengthen bridges between

religious communities by encouraging interreligious action and addressing common grievances (interreligious sphere); and most importantly it seeks to maintain a focus on women and youth and on building the body of knowledge and evidence around FoRB (Cross Cutting sphere).



Among many events during the last couple of years, EIFDDA has utilized International days and hosted various programs for creating shared understanding and information exchange among interfaith groups. This year, during the World Interfaith Harmony (WIHW) week, EIFDDA in collaboration with other Faith Based Organizations (FBOs) has hosted a program as part of commemorating "WORLD

INTERFAITH HARMONY WEEK (WIHW)" to highlight the importance of interfaith cooperation, and its role in conflict prevention and Peacebuilding among Faith Leaders, in which religious actors are sustainable advocates interfaith peace and building resilient and inclusive communities.









## **Succinct Report**

Ethiopia has been facing various challenges including **intra-religious** intolerance which is leading to increased instances of violent confrontation. There is an increase in **inter-religious** violence in areas across the country including violence targeting the construction of specific places of worship or during religious celebrations and there is also limited interaction between different faith group's that fuels mistrust and other many problems.

As part of ongoing program through the Joint Initiative for Strategic Religious Aciont (JISRA), **On February 3rd, 2023**, a one day "Interreligious Peace Dialogue" undertaken to commomorate #WorldInterfaithHarmonyWeek in West Shewa Zone of Oromia Region, Ethiopia.









The theme of the event was "Strengthening Interfaith Harmony and Collaboration to find Solutions for Challenges related to Freedom of Religion and Belief (FoRB) and Interfaith relationship". Over 40 faith and traditional belief leaders including Orthodox, Muslim, Protestant, Catholic as well as traditional leaders (Aba Gedas) have been attended and sensitized on #WIHW, FoRB and Social Cohesion for fostering understanding and cooperation between different religious / cultural /ethnic groups.
