UN's World Interfaith Harmony Week:

The World Interfaith Harmony Week was unanimously adopted by the United Nations on October 20, 2010. Since then, the first week of February has been observed as the World Interfaith Harmony Week.

The week is based on the pioneering work of "The Common World" initiative. This initiative, which started in 2007, called for Muslim and Christian leaders to engage in a dialogue based on two common fundamental religious Commandments; Love of God, and Love of the Neighbour, without nevertheless compromising any of their own religious tenets.

In 2023, World Interfaith Harmony week was celebrated under the theme of 'Harmony in a World in Crises: Working together to achieve Peace, Gender Equality, Mental Health and Wellbeing, and Environmental Preservation'.
