Monday 5th February Event led by a 94 year old retired Roman Catholic Priest

Monsignor Francis Slattery (a 94 year old retired Roman Catholic Priest) led an afternoon session of meditation/prayer and study. Monsignor Slattery commented "Every year this is an occasion to celebrate our differences and richly varied beliefs. It was a joy to be able to come together and just express what we do have in common, even if we do have differences of expression. What we did was share a time of meditation or prayer, of reading the Psalms and a Blessing. This many of us did in our own homes. It was a simple reminder of our togetherness, a fact we share a common language when speaking of our faiths and a joy in knowing others have similar expressions. We have to be thankful at this time for this simple act of faith which hopefully binds us more closely together."
