King Abdullah II Speech



HM King Abdullah has long been known for his peace initiatives. The Amman Message brought together the most authoritative figures of Islam to denounce terrorism, and promote harmony within the world of Islam.

Under his patronage, the Common Word initiative has brought together the highest ranking Christian and

Muslim leaders from around the world on the basis of the two greatest commandments of Loving God, and Loving the Neighbor.

On September 23rd 2010, HM King Abdullah II of Jordan introduced a World Interfaith Harmony Week at the Plenary Session of the 65th UN General Assembly in New York. In his speech he said:

"It is [also] essential to resist forces of division that spread misunderstanding and mistrust especially among peoples of different religions. The fact is, humanity everywhere is bound together, not only by mutual interests, but by shared commandments to love God and neighbour; to love the good and neighbour. This week, my delegation, with the support of our friends on every continent, will introduce a draft resolution for an annual World Interfaith Harmony Week. What we are proposing is a special week, during which the world's people, in their own places of worship, could express the teachings of their own faith about tolerance, respect for the other and peace. I hope this resolution will have your support."

A World Interfaith Harmony Week:

The World Interfaith Harmony Week was first proposed at the UN General Assembly on September 23, 2010 by H.M. King Abdullah II of Jordan. Just under a month later, on October 20, 2010, it was unanimously adopted by the UN and henceforth the first week of February will be observed as a World Interfaith Harmony Week.

The World Interfaith Harmony Week is based on the pioneering work of The Common Word initiative. This initiative, which started in 2007, called for Muslim and Christian leaders to engage in a dialogue based on two common fundamental religious Commandments; Love of God, and Love of the Neighbour, without nevertheless compromising any of their own religious tenets. The Two commandments are at the heart of the three Monotheistic religions and therefore provide the most solid theological ground possible.

The World Interfaith Harmony Week extends the Two Commandments by adding ‘Love of the Good, and Love of the Neighbour’. This formula includes all people of goodwill. It includes those of other faiths, and those with no faith.

The World Interfaith Harmony Week provides a platform—one week in a year—when all interfaith groups and other groups of goodwill can show the world what a powerful movement they

are. The thousands of events organized by these groups often go unnoticed not only by the general public, but also by other groups themselves. This week will allow for these groups to become aware of each other and strengthen the movement by building ties and avoiding duplicating each others' efforts.

It is hoped that this initiative will provide a focal point from which all people of goodwill can recognize that the common values they hold far outweigh the differences they have, and thus provide a strong dosage of peace and harmony to their communities.

***Register Your Event**

The only thing you have to do now to qualify for the grand prize is register your event to our website. You will need to sign up to create events. You can then access your events from the My WIHW menu. You don't need to have all details confirmed before doing so. You can just post the estimated date and timing of your event and log in to edit details as they become available.

❖ Ways to participate in an event in the WIHW:

- **Interfaith Digital Story-Wall & Social Media Campaign**

What: Invite people from different faiths to share a short video/photo/story about a “moment of kindness” in their tradition. Create a digital “story wall” and promote on social media with a hashtag like #WIHW2026.

- **Inter-Faith “Common Values” Workshop with Youth**

What: Bring together young members of different faith communities for a workshop exploring what shared values they hold (service, compassion, justice etc). Then have them co-design a small project (e.g., a joint service activity) to be carried out that week.

- **Interfaith Service Day + Photo-Gallery**

What: A morning where faith communities come together for a service activity (e.g., clean-up of a park, planting trees, refurbishing a community-centre). Afterwards display a “before & after” photo gallery or short exhibition (in a local community hall, church/mosque foyer or even online).

- **Interfaith Film Night & Discussion**

What: Screen a film (or two short films) that highlight inter-faith themes, then have a discussion panel with representatives of different faiths + audience Q&A. Follow with refreshments.

Why it's timely: Visual storytelling still resonates and the discussions can deep-dive to build understanding. Some past winners of WIHW used film-series.

- **Interfaith Breakfast / Brunch with Open Table**

What: Simple, but effective: invite people of various faiths to a breakfast or brunch, seated randomly (so people from different faiths sit together) and include a short sharing session.

- **World Bazaar / Food & Culture Fair with Interfaith Crafts**

What: A mini-fair where each faith community has a stall/booth: could showcase food, craft, music, stories of their faith/tradition.

Visitors move around, sample, ask questions, learn. Include a “kids zone” with inter-faith arts & crafts.

- **Inter-Faith Dialogue “Walk & Talk” – Local Heritage Route**

What: Create a short walking route where small interfaith mixed groups walk together, stop at a couple of points (with short reflection prompts) and end with tea/refreshments.

- **Interfaith Arts & Music Night**

What: Invite musicians, poets, artists from different faith backgrounds to perform pieces inspired by their tradition, then open mic for audience reflections. Could include visual art show or interactive art piece (e.g., “What brings us together?” wall).

- **Greening Sacred Spaces / Eco-Interfaith Project**

What: Partner faith communities with one local environment initiative (e.g., planting native trees on the grounds of a local place of worship; composting initiative; recycling drive) – highlight how faith leads to stewardship of planet & people.

- **Interfaith Online Challenge / “7-Day Kindness”**

What: Over the week (1–7 Feb), invite participants to do one simple act each day (across faith communities) for each other – e.g., hand-write a note, invite someone from another tradition for tea, share a meal, plant a flower, help a neighbour. Use a hashtag, post on social media, share reflections. Cap it with a gathering on the final day.

❖ The prizes are:

The Royal Aal Al-Bayt Institute for Islamic Thought in Jordan established the World Interfaith Harmony Week Prize in 2013 to recognize the three best events organized during the UN World Interfaith Harmony Week (first week of February) which best promote the goals of the World Interfaith Harmony Week. Prizes are awarded to each event that is judged to have been most successful in promoting interfaith harmony and impacting religious understanding. Since 2014, this prize has been known as the H.M. King Abdullah II World Interfaith Harmony Week Prize.

In judging, the judges took into consideration the excellence of efforts, collaboration and impact of events. They looked carefully at efforts made despite scantiness of resources, unfavourable political and social climates, and also took into consideration consistent efforts made over the years. They further took into consideration whether events were consistent with the text of the UN Resolution establishing the Prize. Accordingly, judges did not reward movements towards religious syncretism but rather rewarded events which respected each religion as it is. Finally, in accordance with the terms of the Prize, judges rewarded events specifically celebrating the World Interfaith Harmony Week rather than good interfaith work in general.

Winners of HM King Abdullah II of Jordan Prize for WORLD INTERFAITH HARMONY WEEK 2013 - 2025

Now, we'd like to present the winners of HM King Abdullah II of Jordan Prize ,for this great event . This resolution was adopted by the UN on October 20, 2010, and the first week of February, every year, has been declared a UN World Interfaith Harmony Week.

Communities, took the prayers from the places of worship to the people. We decided that from now on, every year we will identify a troubled location and take our prayers there. The violence in some of our suburbs is so bad that "death by violence" daily figures are considerably higher than those in war zones in other parts of Africa.

The prayers should touch the people and include the people who need their upliftment. Also, we raise the consciousness of neighbourliness, so that people become aware of their responsibility to their neighbour. We become each others' neighbours even when we do not live next door to each other, but rather live in the next suburb.

The traditions represented included Buddhist, Baha'i, Muslim, Christian, Hindu, Hare Krishna, Brahma Kumaris and Unitarian. Everyone had a turn to pray or sing or bring a poem – anything that would contribute to the sense of unity and encouragement that we wanted to generate.



The event was moderated by Nancy Falcon, an Interfaith Dialogue Expert from Argentina/Italy and Dr. Rajendran Govender, a Social Cohesion Advocate from South Africa. Mr. Kilic introduced the moderators who are members of the JWF's Interfaith Committee and Advisory Board and are close collaborators and friends. The webinar featured two distinguished experts in interreligious and interfaith dialogue: Casey B. Dolan, Africa Coordinator at ISHA Foundation, and Maria Eugenia Crespo, Director of Member Support at United Religion Initiative (URI) in Argentina.

By providing a platform for voices from diverse



backgrounds to be heard and shared, the webinar underscored the transformative potential of interfaith dialogue in promoting peace and fostering a deeper sense of interconnectedness among all members of the global community. In essence, it served as a testament to the power of dialogue, empathy, and collective action in building bridges of understanding and cooperation across cultural, religious, and geographical divides.


