

Religious freedom today



Too many countries in the world today simply do not allow for citizens to exercise their right to freedom of religion. Cases abound where states have imposed restrictive sanctions, thereby making it difficult and in some cases impossible for the individual to respond in conscience to the call to transcendence.

Religious freedom is a fundamental right of all human beings, a fundamental tenet of the 1948 Universal Declaration of Human Rights, and is protected under the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights of 1976.

While in some nations, freedom of religious worship may receive constitutional recognition, many governments continue to repress religious freedom and even openly antagonize persons on the basis of their religion.

Repression of religious freedom runs contrary to universally shared values and undermines genuine stability. Freedom of religion is essential in order to guarantee a constitutional order of society; it is fundamental for building a society according to justice and peace.
